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Youth in Trades Program

- Programs are **school based** and **college based** and offer hands-on skills acquisition through post-secondary technical training to students in grades 11/12 (apply in grades 10/11). **The first level of tuition is FREE (savings of ~\$2500-4000)** - paid for by the Richmond School Board. Programs offered .
- **School Based** Programs offered are Cooking, plumbing, Early Childhood Education & Manufacturing & Engineering and are held at one of the RSD high schools..
- **Youth Work in Trades** program means students aged 15-19 "earn while they learn", acquiring high school credits and industry credentialing in recognized trade, while in high school and working part-time.

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Youth in Trades Cont'd

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Typical University Requirements

- English 12
 - Program-specific requirements
- Variety of courses taken in grade 11 and 12
 - Social Studies
 - Sciences
 - Mathematics
 - Fine and Performing Arts
 - Technologies and Trades
 - Languages

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University Admissions

- 1) High school Graduation
- 2) Apply before the stated deadline
- 3) Personal Profile
- 4) English 12
- 5) 5+ additional academic courses (variable, but recommended)
 - Institution-specific (min grades in certain subjects)
 - Program specific (completion of specific 11 and 12 subjects eg. Faculty of Science or Engineering)
- 6) Competitive G.P.A. (AVERAGE) based on
 - English 12 and other required courses depending on program

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College Admissions

- 1) High school Graduation
- 2) English 12 or equivalent
- 3) Arts & Science and University Transfer may require specific Grade 11/12 subjects
- 4) Upgrading options available
- 5) Colleges are “Open Access” Institutions, they do not required on an overall GPA
- 6) Apply Early! First Come First Serve. Note, many popular programs like Nursing, Engineering, Computer Science etc may have limited access and separate deadlines could apply

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Scholarships

- University/College Entrance
- External - Community Based
- School Nominated – See RHS Website under “Students” “Grade 12 Information”
- Valedictory Scholarships – See RHS Website under “Students “Grade 12 Information”
- Applications are comprehensive, often requiring reference letters, nominations, essays and transcripts
- MOST scholarships are available for students to apply in their grade 12 year
