Our activities will primarily revolve around the construction of low-power model rockets and RC planes. We plan to start off the year by constructing simple designs, before moving on to incorporate more advanced features and having design/construction competitions. Explanations of physics and aerodynamics will be included within these activities for those curious. We will be using our prior experience in these hobbies to provide guidance, assistance, and ensure that all participants are behaving safely.
