1. A book with one author

Author's Last name, First name. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Publication Date.

2. A book with two authors

Author's Last name, First name and First name Last name. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Publication Date.

Fraser, Tatiana and Caia Hagel. *Girl Positive: Supporting Girls to Shape a New World*. Random House of Canada, 2016.

3. A book with three or more authors

Author's Last name, First name, et al. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Publication Date.

Rowling, J. K., et al. *Harry Potter and the Cursed Child Parts One and Two*. Scholastic, 2016.

4. A book found on a Website or Database

Author's Last name, First name. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Publication Date. *Title of Website/Database*, URL.

5. A website

Author's Last name, First name. "Article Title." *Title of the website*, Publisher (if different from Title), Publication Date (might be a range of dates), URL.

6. A video

Last name, First name of the creator (if important to your task). "Title of the film/video." *Title of the website*, role of contributors and their First name Last name (if applicable), Posted date, URL.

7. An image

Artist's Last name, First name. *Image Title.* (or Description of Image.) Publication Date. *Title of Website or Database,* URL.

Warby, William. Photograph of Monopoly board game. 23 Dec. 2013. *Flickr*, www.flickr.com/photos/wwarby/11513401305.

8. A journal article from a database (e.g. EBSCO, Gale, JSTOR)

Author's Last name, First name. "Title of the article." *Title of the journal*, vol. #, no. #, Publication Date, Pages, *Database Name*, URL.
